The Challenge

With fast-track growth comes an inevitable communications challenge: how to provide reliable, high quality unified communications in a consistent manner from, and between, a growing number of locations. For Stericycle, that challenge was exacerbated by the fact that many of its near-50 sites are remotely situated, with poor existing connectivity.

When its incumbent service provider was unable to offer the network quality, reliability and flexibility required, Stericycle put the challenge out to tender.

The Solution

Stericycle chose Conn3ct to resolve its communications challenge. EFM, for example, provided an option where ADSL speeds were insufficient or where it proved more cost effective than fibre.

Conn3ct incorporated 3G wireless for backup and an internet gateway allowing for the delivery of voice and other critical applications over an MPLS, SIP-enabled network. In addition, the Conn3ct solution allowed for sophisticated network monitoring and bandwidth control across all sites via an online portal.
